## **STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME**

A Staff Development Programme for all the new faculty members was organized from 5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> July, 2006. In the programme, The Principal, Prof. S.L. Surana explained to the participants about Institute's culture, expectations from the faculty, rules and regulations, course file system, student counselling, etc. Prof. N.K. Banthiya, co-ordinator of the programme, discussed the issues related to characteristics of an effective teacher, student characteristics (adolescent behaviour), classroom communication, listening skills, skill of introducing, skill of explaining, skill of questioning, skill of reinforcement and skill of summarizing. Prof. R.S. Mehta also spoke to the participants on 7<sup>th</sup> of July. He explained how "Johari Window" concept could be utilized for making improvements in individual performance. He also discussed seven habits of highly successful people.

## **NEW LABORATORIES IN MECHANICAL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT**

A number of new laboratories have been established in the Mechanical Engineering department of the Institute. Department has established its own CAD Laboratory. In this laboratory 30 computers have been installed for which authorized software 'Educational Solution Set' has been

A new industrial engineering laboratory has also been established.


Later on prizes were distributed to the winners of Poster competition followed by memento presentation and shawl gifting to the guests.

### **How to Answer Some of the Toughest Interview Questions?**

#### **Q.1 : Tell me about yourself.**

**Traps :** Beware, about 80% of all interviews begin with this "innocent question". Many candidates, skewer themselves by rambling, recapping their life story, etc.

**Best Answer :** Start with the present and tell why you are well-qualified for the position. Remember that the key to all successful interviewing is to match your qualifications to what the interviewer is looking for. This is the single most important strategy in job hunting. Be sure to illustrate with specific examples of your responsibilities and especially your achievements, all of which are geared to present yourself as a perfect match for the needs he has just described.

#### **Q.2 : What are your greatest strengths?**

**Traps :** This question seems like a softball lob, but be prepared. You don't want to come across as egotistical or arrogant. Neither is this a time to be humble.

**Best Answer :** You should have this list at your greatest strengths and core examples from your achievements so well committed to memory that you can recite them cold after being shaken awake at 2.30 AM.

The desirable traits that all employers would love to see in

their employees are :

1. Proven track record achievements.
2. Intelligence
3. Honesty, decency.
4. Good fit with corporate culture.
5. Positive attitude, likeability.
6. Good communication skills.
7. Dedication.
8. Clear Goals.
9. Enthusiasm.
10. Confidence.

#### **Q.3 : What is your greatest weakness?**

**Traps :** Beware this is an elimination question, designed to shorten the candidate list. Any admission of a weakness or fault will earn you an "A" for honesty, but an "F" for the interview.

**Best Answer :** Assure the interviewer that you can think of nothing that would stand in the way of your performing in this position with excellence. Then, quickly review your strongest qualifications.

**Alternate strategy :** Instead of confessing a weakness, describe what you like most & like least, making that what you like most matches up with the most important qualification for success in the position and what you like least is not essential.

#### **Q.4 : Tell me about something you did or failed to do that you**

**now feel a little ashamed of ...**

**Traps :** There are some questions your interviewer has no business asking and this is one. But while you may feel like answering, "None of your business" naturally you can't. Some interviewers ask this question on the chance you admit to something, but if not, at least they'll see how you think on your feet.

Some non-prepared candidates, flustered by this question, unburden themselves of guilt from their personal life or career, perhaps expressing regrets regarding parent, spouse, child, etc. All such answers can be disastrous.

**Best Answer :** As with faults and weaknesses, never confess a regret. But don't seem as if you're stone-walling either.

**Best Strategy :** Say you harbour no regrets, then add a principle or habit you practice regularly for healthy human relations. You can add that if you let people know you appreciate and respect their feelings, you wind up with a highly motivated group, a team that's having fun at work because they're striving for excellence rather than brooding over slights or regrets.

#### **Q.5 : 'The silent treatment'**

**Traps :** Beware if you are unprepared for this question, you will probably not handle it right and possibly not the interview. Thank goodness, most interviewers

don't employ it. It's normally used by those determined to see how you respond under stress.

**Best Answer :** Like a primitive tribal mask, the silent treatment loses all its power to frighten you once you refuse to be intimidated. If your interviewer pulls it, keep quiet yourself for a while and then ask, with sincere politeness and not a trace of sarcasm, "Is there anything else I can fill in on that point?" That's all there is to it whatever you do, don't let the silent treatment intimidate you into talking a view streak because you could easily talk yourself out of the position.

**Q.6 : Why should I hire you?**

**Traps :** Believe it or not, this is a killer question because so many candidates are unprepared for it. If you stammer or adlib you've worn it.

**Best Answer :** Apply the overall strategy of uncovering the employer's needs before you answer question so that you may give him better reasons for hiring you than any one else is likely to give reasons tied directly to his needs.

**Q.7 : Where do you see yourself five years from now?**

**Traps :** One reason, interviewers ask this question, is to see if you're setting for this position, using it merely as a stopper until something better comes along or could be trying to gauge your level of ambition.

**Best Answer :** Reassure your interviewer that you are looking to make a long term commitment that this position entails exactly what you are looking to do and what you do extremely well. As for your future, you believe that if you perform job at hand with excellence, future opportunities will take care of themselves.

**Q. 8 : Why do you want to work at our company?**

**Traps :** This question tests whether you've done any homework about the firm. If you have, you win big.

**Best Answer :** This question is your opportunity to hit the ball out of the park, thanks to the indepth research you should do before any interview.

Best sources for researching your target company annual reports, the corporate newsletter, contacts you know at the company or its suppliers advertisements, articles about the company in the trade press.

**Q. 9 : What are your Career Options right now?**

**Traps :** The interviewer is trying to find out, "How desperate are you?"

**Best Answer :** Prepare for this question by thinking of how you can position yourself as a desired commodity. If you are still working, describe the possibilities at your present firm and why, though you're greatly appreciated there, you're looking for something more

(challenge, responsibility etc.). If you're not working, you can talk about other employment possibilities you're actually exploring. But do this with a light touch, speaking only in general terms.

**Q. 10 : Why have you been out of work so long?**

**Traps :** A tough question if you've been on the beach a long time. You don't want to seem like damaged goods.

**Best Answer :** You want to emphasize factors which have prolonged your job search by your own choice.

**Q. 11 : The "Fatal Flow" question.**

**Traps :** If an interviewer has read your resume carefully he may try to zero in on a "fatal flow" of your candidacy, perhaps that you don't have a college degree .. you've been out of the job market for some time .. you never earned your CPA etc. A Fatal flow question can be deadly, but usually only if you respond by being overly defensive.

**Best Answer :** Whenever you come up against a fatal flow question, be completely honest, open and straight forward about admitting the short coming. Do not apologize or try to explain it away. You know that this supposed flow is nothing to be concerned about and this is the attitude you want your interviewer to adopt as well.

If you are wondering what this KPO means, here's an example. A law firm outsourcing basic case research to trainee lawyers or legal experts in foreign country or may be pharmaceutical company conducting company conducting R&D for new drugs in off shore facilities.

And no prices for guessing which country will be at the centre of action yes India.

Experts say that India will be best-suited for KPO because of its abundance of educated workers and it has the potential to become the number one knowledge producing centre in the world by 2025. It is a story of lilies in the pond, where intellectual capital keeps doubling.

KPO revenues are expected to grow 46% to \$17 per by 2010. Like BPO India might face some competition from Russia, Canada, China & Israel. A lawyer to writing patent application in India could be 50% cheaper in India than the US, according to Evaluserve. Corporates have realised that KPO offers an opportunity to do the things not done till now.

First of all, the concept of a pool of specialised professionals available is a major advantage.

Second, for a dollar that is invested can go so many miles. It is going to be the land of opportunity.

### ABSTRACT

The 'GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM' refers to the aerospace technology that uses satellites & ground equipment to determine position anywhere on earth. GPS receiver "knows" the location of the satellites. It also "knows" it is located somewhere on the surface of an imaginary sphere centered at the satellite. It then determines the size of several spheres, one for each satellite. The receiver is located where these spheres intersect.

The whole GPS system has three segments.

- **Space segment** : The space segment consists of the GPS satellites. These space vehicles (SVs) send radio signals from space.
- **Control segment** : The control segment consists of a system of tracking stations located around the world.
- **User segment** : The GPS user segment consists of the GPS

receivers and the user community.

Satellites in space segment transmit signals that have two types of modulated carriers, modulated by three distinct codes.

Position in ECEF coordinates is converted into geodetic coordinates.

DGPS is further advancement of GPS. The idea behind all differential positioning is to correct bias errors at one location with measured bias errors at a known position. A reference receiver, or bias station, computes corrections for each satellite signals.

Types of GPS services:

- Precise Positioning Service (PPS)
  - Standard Positioning Service (SPS)
- GPS services are used mainly in below mentioned areas:
- Location - determining a basic position
  - Navigation - getting from one location to another
  - Tracking - monitoring the movement of people and things
  - Mapping- creating maps of the world
  - Timing- bringing precise timing to the world

No doubt, GPS is the revolution in the field of navigation. It is more efficient, reliable and cheaper than RADAR, so compact in size that it is now being fitted in the cars availability to common civilians has made it really popular.
